Here is a quote from Reverend Hudson Taylor, "I have found that there are three stages in every great work of God: first, it is impossible, then it is difficult, then it is done." In 2022, the Book Gifting ministry swung like a pendulum between "impossible" and "difficult", yet with God's help, our goal was ultimately reached: 2,108 sets of pastoral resources were sent to 35 seminaries with nearly 22,000 copies of printed materials made available to the novice pastors in China.



We wholeheartedly bless the graduates who completed their courses despite the difficult external situation.

Circumventing the Impossible and Difficult Barricades

After the Chinese New Year of 2022, our logistics partners in China were sealed off in a quarantine area, nothing was allowed to go in or come out. The Book Gifting team felt stuck. How could we distribute the book packages? A message from our publishing partner in China came as a sudden bright flash, "If you encounter delivery issues due to the pandemic, we can help with distributing the book packages." Isn't it amazing? God had already torn down the "impossible" barricade even before we asked for His help.



We were thrilled to receive help from our publishing partners in China in the delivery of the 2022 Book Gifting packages.



Requesting the direct delivery of books to locations designated by graduates is a sign of great trust and affirmation of the seminaries toward the Book Gifting team.

When the pandemic was rampaging in China, some areas were sealed off and put under "closed district management". Even transportation of local supplies was banned. Two schools requested us to arrange direct delivery of the book packages to locations specified by graduates instead of bulk delivery to the schools. This is a very unusual

arrangement as the seminaries need to provide pertinent contact information to us. We are thankful that the seminaries trust us to such an extent and recognize the value of the Book Gifting ministry! Our Heavenly Father has paved the way by removing the "difficult" barricade!

The Book Gifting ministry has been going on for 11 years. Last year we received a letter of appreciation from the graduate for the first time. "Upon graduation, we are about to leave for our full time serving, the valuable books you have given us is like fuel for our upcoming ministry ... When we received books such as (a series of book titles), we thanked God wholeheartedly because He always renders timely provisions; in order to live up to the earnest expectation of your team, we will use these books astutely in our ministry ...," said the graduate of the appreciation letter. Seeing the long list of book titles in the letter, the team could feel the high expectation of the graduates towards the books and their genuine gratitude for the team's relentless effort in delivering the books to them amid the difficult situation.

When we look back on our footsteps, we cannot help but thank our Heavenly Father unceasingly for leading the team through unforeseeable situation and overcome seemingly unsurmountable obstacles.

There is a great deal of uncertainty affecting theology students' course completion and graduation, review and approval of materials to be published, and site visit arrangements, but we will continue to liaise with seminaries and pursue publication and reprints of materials relentlessly. As printing, storage and logistics

costs keep rising, utilization of financial resources needs to be very prudent. We sincerely invite you to remember the needs of the upcoming graduation class.
